Our Land, My People: The Struggle of the Lubicon Cree

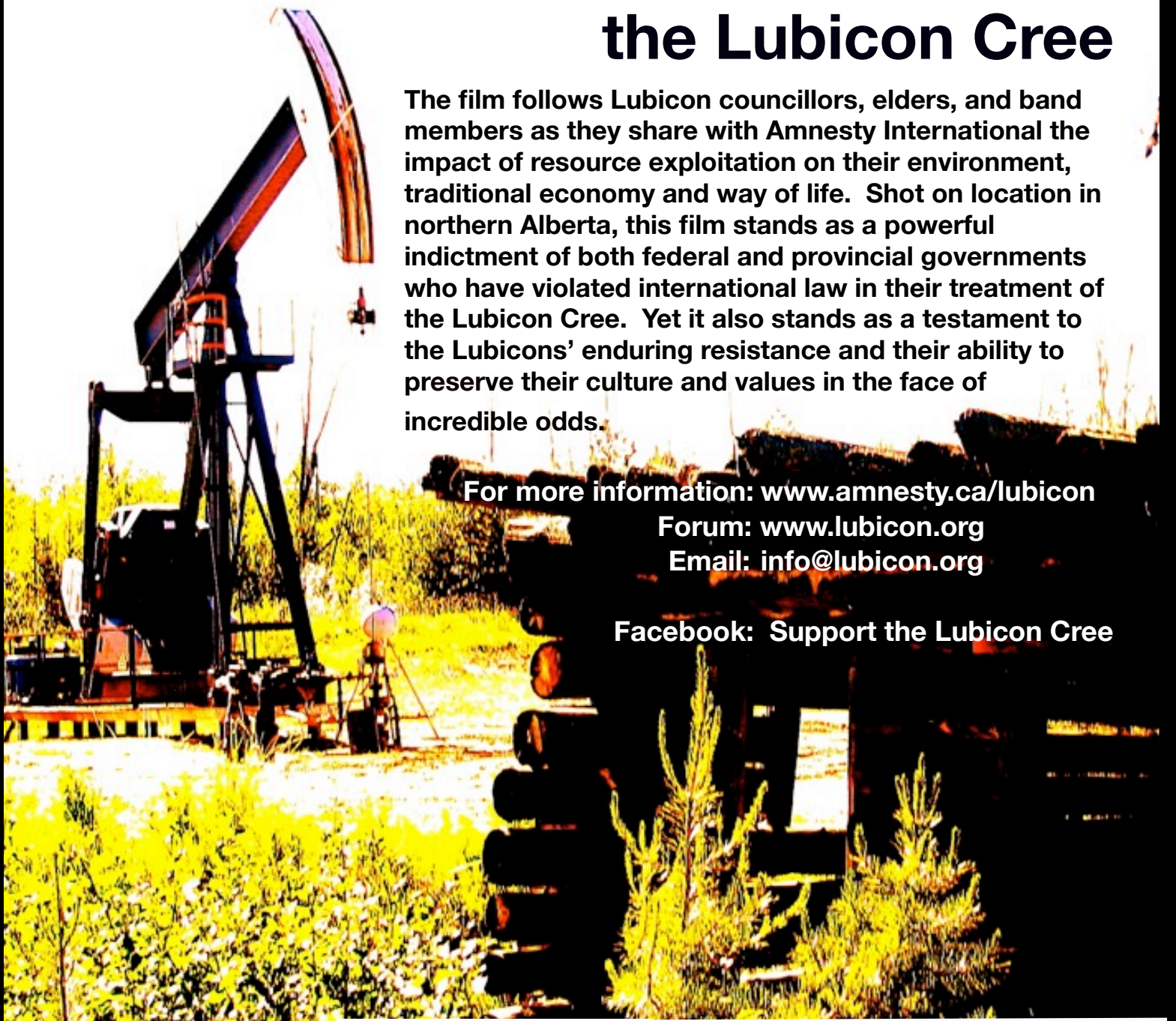
